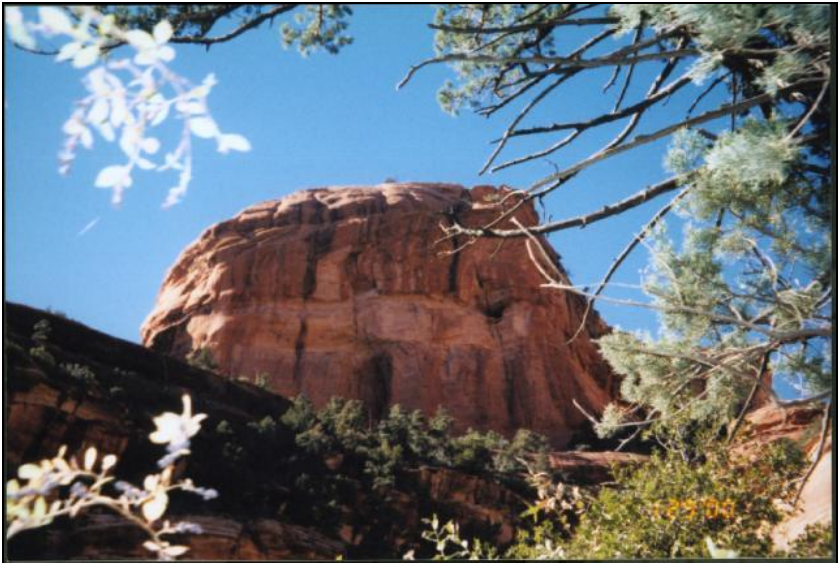

Bible Today: Sundays

The City of God by St. Augustine (DVD Lecture Series)

Take a historical and theological journey through the final years of the ancient world. Key arguments and historical context necessary are highlighted. Witness how Augustine wrestles with some of the thorniest philosophical challenges of any time, including the problem of evil, faith versus reason, fate versus free will, and the very nature of God. This study is in progress but can be joined at any time.

Twelve Ordinary Men: How the Master Shaped His Disciples for Greatness and What He Wants To Do With You, by John F. MacArthur

We do not have to be perfect to do God's work. The twelve disciples' many weaknesses are forever preserved in the pages of the New Testament. Jesus chose ordinary men - fishermen, tax collectors, political zealots - and turned their weakness into strength, producing greatness from people. Christ's careful, hands-on training of the original twelve disciples is shown to today's modern disciple - you.

Martin Luther: Visionary Reformer by Scott H. Hendrix

Martin Luther was neither an unblemished saint nor a single-minded religious zealot according to this new biography by Scott Hendrix. Luther is presented as a man of his time: a highly educated scholar and teacher and a gifted yet flawed human being driven by an optimistic yet ultimately unrealized vision of “true religion.” The focus is on Luther’s entire life, his personal relationships and his political motivations, rather than on his theology alone.

Study of the Book of St. Mark

The book of Mark tells of Jesus’ ministry in more detail than either Matthew or Luke. It relates what Jesus did in a vivid style, where one incident follows directly upon another. Mark stresses Jesus’ message about the kingdom of God breaking into human life as good news and Jesus himself as the gospel of God. Jesus is the Son whom God has sent to rescue humanity by serving and by sacrificing his life. This study will be followed by a study of the Prophets in April.

Reformation 500

500 Years of Evangelical Reformation 1517-2017

When Martin Luther posted his “Ninety-five Theses” on the church door in Wittenberg in 1517, no one expected the breadth of evangelical reforms in Christian teaching and practice that followed. In every dimension of Christian faith a renewed trust in God’s forgiving mercy replaced a reliance on teachings and practices that, like the sale of indulgences, were vulnerable to abuse and corruption.

Preaching a few years later, Luther said, “I opposed indulgences ... but never with force. I simply taught, preached, and wrote God’s Word; otherwise I did nothing. I did nothing; the Word did everything.” When he began to propose reforms in worship, he wrote similar words. “This is the sum of the matter: let everything be done so that the Word may have free course.”

Nearly 500 years later, the results of this evangelical confidence in God’s forgiving and liberating Word are evident today in Christian communities of all types. (www.elca.org)

LCR will be celebrating Reformation 500 through various worship, bible today, daily discipleship and fellowship events. A few are listed below. Watch the weekly and the website for further details.

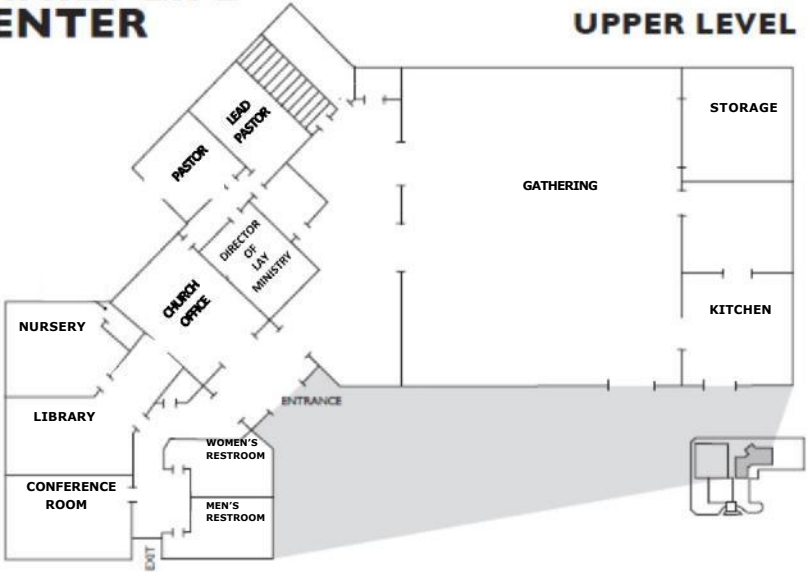

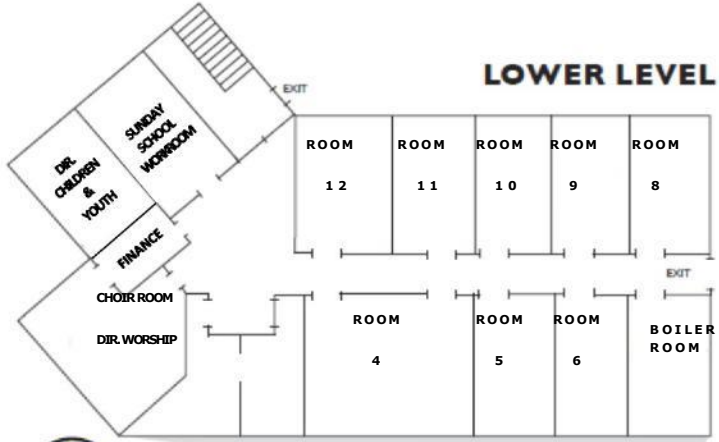
