












## Ash Wednesday Services

# A Different Kind of Outreach: Immigration Assistance

One of LCR's recent outreach ministries has been to assist a physician entering the United States from the Democratic Republic of the Congo (DRC). He is seeking political asylum. He was a practicing physician in the DRC. He uncovered and exposed the misuse of Covid 19 funds by corrupt public officials. As a result, he was kidnapped, tortured and had to leave his country for his own safety.

Political asylum is granted by the U.S. Department of Citizenship and Immigration Services (CIS). The process takes many years and begins with correctly filing the application, having it accepted by CIS, and carefully following each subsequent step of the process. Ninety days after CIS accepts the application, the applicant can request a work permit. The work permit will be issued after another 90 days. With the work permit, he can apply for his Social Security card, a driver's license, and begin contributing to his new homeland - the U.S. He will immediately seek work in the healthcare industry. He previously focused on infectious disease and pediatrics. He will pursue these specialties as he can in the U.S., as well as continue his education.

Individual members of LCR have assisted him to find and retain an expert immigration attorney. LCR and these individuals have funded the reduced fee required by the attorney. The asylum application was successfully produced, submitted, and accepted by CIS. The work permit will be filed this coming week.

He is beyond grateful for the help and support he has been given here at LCR. And he repeatedly promises to dedicate the rest of his life to helping others.
